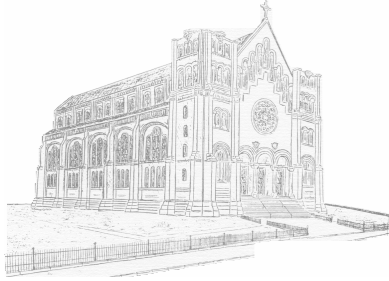

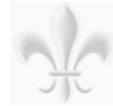

Brothers and Sisters in Our Lord Jesus,

Last Sunday's Gospel was about the importance of relationships, marriage, family and all those we care for as brothers and sisters in the Lord. The Pharisees tried to use this hotly debated topic in Jesus' time to trip him up. Perhaps because they knew that many of Jesus' close friends and followers had come from or were the cause of much familial strife, division and hurt.

Jesus always showed compassion and mercy for the weakness of others. But he does call us to reflect on the importance of relationships in our life. To see our family and community as the domestic Church, and as our vocation to grow in holiness through love. Jesus was realistic about the human nature of those who love each other and that our love is not perfect. His suffering, in part, was caused by the betrayal of those who loved him, by the jealousy of those around him, and by the silence of those with power over him.

As I write this a couple of days before surgery, I thank God for you, my family in Christ. I am strengthened by your own honesty and transparency in the crosses you bear, in the courage and faith that you witness to in suffering, and by the love and support you show me in my time of need. I think of St. Paul who in his own suffering heard God say to him, "my grace is sufficient, for my power is perfected in weakness." At times of need, when we are weak, physically or spiritually perhaps like never before I can see the grace and power of our Lord in those who bring healing, in those who show compassion and in a family of faith like you all, that God has given to me as a great grace. God bless you!

Through his suffering, my servant shall justify many. — *Isaiah 53:11*

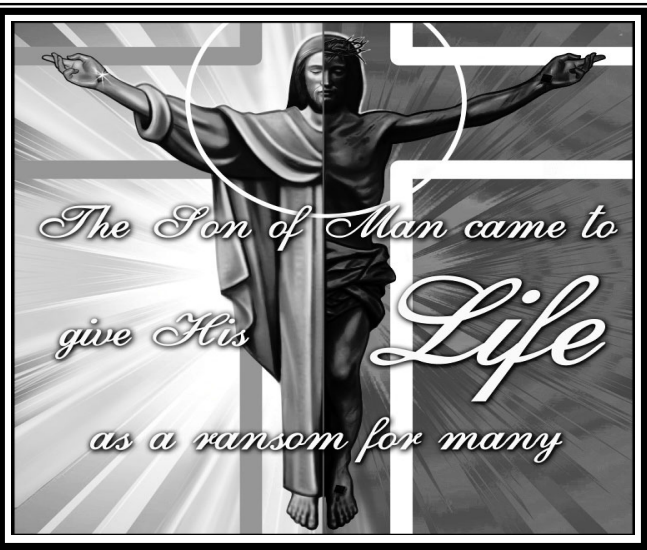

TODAY’S READINGS

First Reading — The man said, “This one is bone of my bones and flesh of my flesh; this one shall be called ‘woman’” (Genesis 2:18-24).

TOO MUCH INFORMATION!

There is a common expression: “Too much information!” We usually use it when people tell us details about their lives that we don’t want or need to know. Today, when James and John ask Jesus a simple question, making their request for places of honor in the kingdom, a simple answer might have been in order. Instead, as he often does, Jesus answers a question with a question; today it’s about drinking the cup of suffering. Then, once the others are indignant over James and John’s outrageous request, he proceeds to give them what may have been “too much information” for followers who were simply interested in the pursuit of glory. But this though it can sometimes seem “too much” for us, is essential for our lives as disciples. In all readings today, we learn this information. It is in suffering, in weakness, in self-giving service to others, that we come to understand the kingdom. It is the information we need to find our place and come to be honored in the reign of God.
