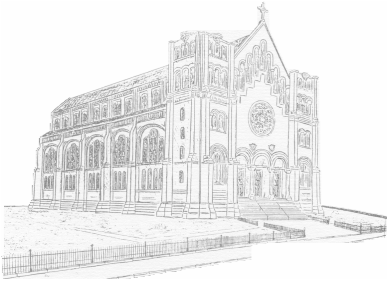

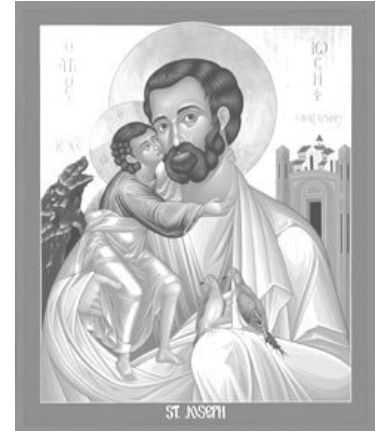

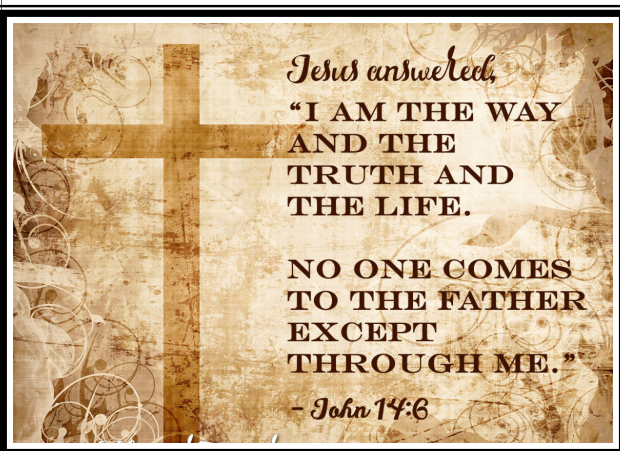
Even Greater Things
